

CAPITALIZATION RULES

- Able to correctly capitalize the first word in a quotation in a sentence
- Able to correctly capitalize important words in titles of books and poems
- Able to correctly capitalize proper nouns in writing
- Able to correctly capitalize greetings and closings in a letter.

PUNCTUATION

- Able to insert a period for abbreviations
- Able to correctly use a comma in direct address
- Able to correctly use a comma after yes or no when they introduce a sentence
- Able to correctly use a comma to separate phrases in a series
- Able to correctly use a comma before a conjunction to link clauses
- Able to correctly use a comma to set off direct quotations
- Able to correctly use an apostrophe in possessives
- Able to correctly use quotation marks before and after a speaker's exact words
- Able to correctly use end marks in writing

SENTENCE TYPE

SIMPLE

- Able to identify sentence type as declarative
- Able to write a declarative sentence
- Able to identify sentence type as imperative
- Able to write an imperative sentence
- Able to identify sentence type as interrogative
- Able to write an interrogative sentence
- Able to identify sentence type as exclamatory
- Able to write an exclamatory sentence
- Able to identify direct objects in a sentence

COMPOUND

- Able to identify compound subjects in a sentence
- Able to write a sentence with a compound subject
- Able to identify compound predicate in a sentence
- Able to write a sentence with a compound predicate
- Able to identify a compound or complex sentence
- Able to write compound and complex sentences
- Able to identify phrases, independent clauses and dependent clauses

PLURAL RULES

- Write regular plural nouns by adding -s or -es in writing
- Write irregular plural nouns correctly in writing
