
## **ELA Daily Activities**

- Lessons taught in group centers, whole class, and independent practice.


Literacy skills are integrated in all subjects and activities throughout the day.

-We continue the handwriting journey by providing meaningful practice and application for manuscript handwriting reinforcement.






- \*Each lesson is guided with step-by-step instruction using models and pictures.

\*FOSS Science Resource: A wide range of experiences that help build student understanding of science concepts and scientific habits of mind.


\*Students take part in investigations and observations.
